General Information:

Wallace State Community College offers high school juniors and seniors an opportunity to dual enroll career technical coursework on the campus of Wallace State. The Career Tech Dual Enrollment Scholarship is offered for select programs in the Technical and Health Division. This scholarship is available during fall, spring, and summer semesters and will pay full tuition and fees for up to 6 credit hours of college coursework. Many schools will allow students to check in/out of school to come to Wallace to take classes through this scholarship program. Students should speak to their high school counselors for more information.

Admission Requirements:

Student must complete a Career Technical/Health Dual Enrollment application and submit it along with all required documents to his/her high school counselor. The school administration will then recommend the student for the program if the student has met all necessary criteria. The counselor will complete the remainder of the application and submit the application along with an official high school transcript and high school recommendation. Please note that students interested in any listed health programs must also submit a completed health program application to be considered. Scholarship acceptance will be contingent upon student's acceptance into the health program.

Application Packets due to WSCC—March 20, 2017 (High school counselors will submit completed application packets to WSCC.)

Applications received after the deadline will only be considered if space is available.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

General entry qualifications will include the following:

- GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Accuplacer Placement Exam or Comparable ACT scores – 18 in English, 20 in math and reading
- High school junior or senior

Cost of program:

Tuition for select programs will be paid using WFD funds (Career Technical/Health Dual Enrollment Scholarship). The scholarship pays for **two** classes each semester up to a maximum of 6 college credit hours as long as funds are available. Students may be responsible for costs associated with books, materials, and supplies needed for these programs. Please note that eligible programs are determined by the State Board of Education and the local workforce development agency and are subject to change. Students who choose to enroll in programs which are not included on this list will be responsible for all tuition, fees, books, materials, and supplies. Wallace State was selected to participate in an experimental pilot program regarding Federal Pell Grants. The experimental pilot program is limited to Alabama public high school students in the WSCC service area. Qualified students will be able to use Pell Grant funds beginning fall semester. WSCC graduation fee \$30.

Continuous Eligibility:

Students who meet the criteria for initial admission to a Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit program as specified in the ACCS Procedure for Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit for High School Students, Section 2, will remain in continuous eligibility as long as a grade of "C" or better in all attempted college courses is earned. Students who fail to meet this minimum grade requirement or who withdraw from a course will be suspended from the program for a minimum of one term. The one term suspension may not be served during the summer term. The student may not re-enroll until the suspension has been served. For re-entry, the student must reapply to the program and must meet the minimum (unweighted) grade point average of 2.5 for Career Technical or 3.0 for Academic. Students re-entering Fast Track will be responsible for cost for tuition, fees, books, materials, and supplies.



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Programs Eligible for CTDE Scholarship

Program selection should be written on front of application (Intended Major or Program of Study). Please select from the following programs:

- Air Conditioning/Refrigeration - ACR (excludes special topics)
- Automotive Manufacturing Technology – AUT
- Industrial Electronics Technology – ILT
(Biomedical Tech., Mechatronics, Technology Communications)
- Machining – MTT
- Welding – WDT

The following programs may or may not have course options that will work in a high school schedule. If interested, please contact the department to find out how scheduling might work for you. Students may only begin these programs during the fall semester.

- Emergency Management Services - EMS (ACT=17)* ^ (Must turn 18 first semester)
- Medical Assistant - MAT (ACT = 17)*
- Pharmacy Tech-PHM * ^ (must turn 18 first semester)

***Students interested in any listed health programs must also submit a completed health program application to be considered. Scholarship acceptance will be contingent upon student's acceptance into the health program.**

^Students interested in EMS or Pharmacy Technology must turn 18 within their first semester of admission in order to be eligible for the program.

Eligible programs are determined by the State Board of Education and the local workforce development agency and are subject to change. If changes are made, updated program lists will be supplied to the local high school.

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
