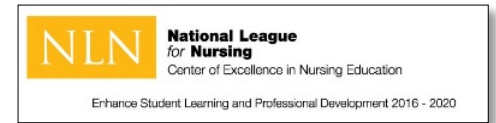

- A minimum of 2.5 GPA for nursing required academic core courses.
