- Crime Scene Technician Short-Term Certificate**
 - Collect, process, and analyze fingerprints
 - Latent and Henry System Classification
 - Collect such physical evidence as bodily fluids and weapons
 - Create crime scene sketches
 - Decide which items should be collected at the crime scene
 - List evidence and prepare it for safe transfer to the crime lab
 - Take photographs of evidence, and crime scenes

All Criminal Justice students are encouraged to meet with an advisor in **Criminal Justice** prior to starting the program, if possible.
